Australia will send a warship, war plane and Defence Force personnel to the Persian Gulf to join an international effort to combat action in the Straits of Homuz.

PM Morrison announced the move this morning saying it was in support of U.S.-led efforts to keep the Straits of Homuz open to

shipping.

America's European allies have been loth to join these efforts for fear of provoking open conflict. PM Morrison (however) says: "Australia's core interest in this mission is de-escalation".

The Labor Party supports Scott Morrison's decision

ALP Shadow Minister for Defence, Richard Marles said:

"The opposition supported the commitment on the basis that it was "tightly framed" around freedom of navigation for commercial shipping in the Gulf."



Negative response to U.S. request from other countries

Japan, NZ, South Korea, Germany and Spain are among the countries that have refused to accede to the U.S. request to send ships and military forces to the Straits of Hormuz.

Russia's Response:


"We have an impression that Washington is just seeking a pretext to both escalate tensions and pursue its aggressive rhetoric against

Iran and proceed to a more active phase of the conflict", Foreign Ministry Spokeswoman Maria Zakharova said at a briefing in Moscow on Thursday.

"There is a feeling that Washington is looking for a pretext for war," the Russian foreign ministry announced.

China's response:

China's foreign minister voiced opposition to the U.S.'s unilateral sanctions against Iran and pledged to support Tehran's efforts to safeguard its interests, as the U.S. ratchets up pressure on the Islamic Republic's economy.



And what does Iran say ?

"Iran is capable of shutting the Strait of Hormuz -- a crucial choke-point for oil flows -- but doesn't want to do it", the country's foreign minister said.


"We certainly have the ability to do it, but we certainly don't want to do it because the Strait of Hormuz and the Persian Gulf are our lifeline," Mohammad Javad Zarif said Wednesday in an interview with Bloomberg Television in New York. "It has to be secured. We play a big role in securing it, but it has to be secure for everybody."

Recently, Iranian's President Hassan Rouhani said: "Iran does not

seek tension with the world. We want security in the Middle East. We want better and friendly ties with other countries". Furthermore, commenting on nuclear weapons, he said," Seeking nuclear bomb weapons was banned under a fatwa issued by Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei", referring to a religious decree issued in the early 2000s by Iran's top authority that bans the development or use of nuclear weapons."We have never wanted nuclear weapons because of our supreme leader's fatwa," he said.

The PM's decision made by himself and some faceless security advisors was never debated in Parliament or in the public domain.

It is strongly opposed in the Australian community



Peter Leahy, ex Chief of the Australian Army says: "I am not sure how the deployment of a war ship and war plane is going to de-escalate things". He says he is not surprised at the decision but he had been hoping that the government would not deploy to the Straits of Hormuz at all.... "Without the strategies being clearly defined and the red

line drawn, I think there is a severe chance of mission creep". "I think the US should pull back from maximum pressure; Iran is at breaking point and we don't need them at that point when their alternatives and means of action is very limited".

The Green's Leader

Richard Di Natalie says:"

"It is a grave mistake for Australian troops to be deployed to the Strait of Hormuz: it shows nothing was learned from the catastrophe that was the invasion of Iraq.

The senator said it's "a conflict that risks escalating severely, a conflict that was provoked by the US itself by withdrawing from the Iran nuclear deal".

He raised concerns that the deployment could spill Australian blood and cost lives and instead



“cool heads” and diplomacy is needed.



Paul Barratt is a former Department of Defence secretary and a Deputy Secretary of Foreign Affairs and Trade:

"I again call on the Prime Minister to hold a debate in our Parliament before the ADF is deployed. It is imperative that no military action – or any hostile action that could foreseeably lead to military action – be undertaken before such a debate occurs, along with a vote by all our elected representatives.

Australian foreign policy should be made by Australians, not by the incumbent of the White House who has trashed one of the best examples in recent years of what diplomacy can achieve."

The Medical Association for Prevention of War strongly criticises the Australian government's decision to join yet another military adventure in the Middle East, this time against Iran.


“Australian governments have learnt nothing from the multiple military deployments we've made since 2001”, said MAPW President Dr Sue Wareham.

“The government's claim that they want de-escalation is nonsense”, Dr Wareham said.

“Warships and surveillance aircraft are not the way to de-escalate a crisis. If we wanted de-escalation, we would make it clear to the US that we want resumption of the JCPOA. In addition, this matter would be debated in our



parliament, so that all options could be addressed.”


Pax Christi : Prof. Joseph Camilleri:

Australia shows contempt for an international rules-based order, agreeing to join the US and UK with a naval, air and ADF personel presence in the Persian Gulf without any national debate or UN resolution.

PM Scott Morrison announced today that Australia would join an international mission to protect trade through the Strait of Horumz. The international force consists of the UK, US, Australia and Bahrain.

Spokesperson for the Independent and Peaceful Australia network, Ms Brownlie said: "This is being presented as protection of the flow of oil through the Persian Gulf and in Australia's national interest, but it is clear the US is chafing at the bit for an opportunity to attack Iran having spent many years imposing harsh sanctions on the people and most recently pulling out of the JCPOA effectively destroying prospects for peace with Iran."

"it is also worth noting the irresponsibility of our government in allowing our oil stocks to be so low making us more vulnerable to supply issues creating a dependence on the US to provide back-up

reserves”

“The last illegal action taken by the US ,UK and Australia was to form the so-called coalition of the willing to mount an attack and invasion of Iraq opening a pandora’s box of instability in the whole region”

“Australia has no interest in a conflict in the Persian Gulf, and no enmity towards Iran. Such a conflict without a UN Security Council resolution would be illegal, and would expose Australian leaders and the ADF to accusations of the war crime of aggression,” said Ms Brownlie.

Former secretary of the defence department, Paul Barratt, told The Guardian. Australian involvement in potential military action in the Gulf could be illegal, and argued it was “very foolish for us to get involved in this provocative behaviour”.

“This is an application of military force. There ought to be a debate in the parliament, and we ought not to engage in any activity that would foreseeably involve the use of military force without that debate,” he said.

“Australian leaders need to heed the lessons of the past. Its time we decoupled from US foreign policy and act independently in the interests of peace and stability,” said Ms Brownlie.

American Missiles in Darwin?

While in Australia last week for the annual Australia-US Ministerial Consultations (AUSMIN), U.S. Secretary of State, Mike Pompeo,

twice hinted at the possibility of Australia becoming host to American missiles pointed at China. The idea was floated after U.S. Secretary of Defence, Mark Esper, announced America's withdrawal from the Intermediate Range Nuclear Forces (INF) Treaty and declared the Pentagon's intention to deploy conventional ground-launched missiles in Asia.....

The Australian government characterises Australia-U.S. military exercises as enhancing interoperability, and the Australia-US alliance more broadly as compatible with Australian sovereignty. At the same time, Australia is now more integrated and dependent on the U.S. than at any other time in its history, bound together by what former ambassador to the U.S., Kim Beazley, has referred to as the "deep state" among the intelligence communities, the military and the arms industry.

Consequently, it is now extremely difficult for Australia to extricate itself from any potential future U.S. wars, including most worryingly with China, and it makes it near impossible for the Australian Defence Force to conduct its own independent military operations without U.S. approval and support.

That should be of concern to all Australians, whether we end up hosting American missiles or not.

US missiles in north Australia not ruled out

Foreign Minister Marise Payne has danced around discussing the deployment of US ground-based missiles in the north of Australia, saying only that the country "consistently welcomed (US) force and presence."

This weekend's Australia-US ministerial consultations in Sydney come soon after the termination of the Intermediate-Range Nuclear Forces Treaty, an arms control agreement between the US and Russia that has stood since 1988.

US Defense Secretary Mark Esper has since told reporters he'd like to see ground-based arms stationed in Asia as a military deterrent amid what he perceives as "an era of great power competition".

When asked about the prospect of US ground-based, non-nuclear missiles stationed in the north of Australia, Senator Payne and Defence Minister Linda Reynolds kept their cards close to their chests.

Gas company Inpex has been fined after it was found to have released PFAS from its new \$37 billion LNG processing plant site on Darwin Harbour.

- The Federal Government found Inpex evaporated PFAS water at its plant instead of trucking it away
- Inpex was fined \$12,600 for infringing its environmental management plan
- Inpex says it paid the fine even though it believed it had complied with the plan

A Federal Environment and Energy Department investigation found the release of the PFAS in September last year put wildlife, including dolphins, and dugongs at risk.

The activity, the Department said, "is likely to have released PFAS into the air and therefore may have placed the immediate environment including Darwin Harbour, at risk of heightened PFAS levels."

Second Wave' of 'West Papua Uprising' commences in struggle for independence referendum

- Tens of thousands of people take to the streets in second wave of protests;
- One person killed, several shot and dozens arrested by the Indonesian security services;

Tens of thousands of West Papuans are taking to the streets this week in a 'second wave' of the West Papua Uprising, following mass demonstrations against Indonesian rule last week. Sparked by

the racist abuse and arrests of West Papuan students in Surabaya on August 17, rallies have taken place across West Papua on a scale not seen since the Papuan Spring of 1999-2000. Protestors are demanding a referendum as the only way forward for a peaceful conflict resolution in West Papua.

A rally was held in Canberra on 22 August to support Bernard Collaery (Witness K's lawyer) and David McBride the military lawyer who exposed possible war crimes in Afghanistan. They were both in court on the day.

They are being used to conceal government fraud. 





**Nuclear Power – No
Solution to Climate
Change**

A new Friends of the Earth Australia statement goes into detail about the reasons why federal and state legal bans against the development of nuclear power should be maintained. The statement notes that nuclear power would inhibit the development of more effective solutions; that 'Small Modular Reactors' are non-existent and about half of the small number under construction are designed to facilitate access to fossil fuel reserves in the Arctic and elsewhere; that there are disturbing connections between nuclear power, nuclear weapons proliferation and militarism more generally; that it would be a quarter-century or more before nuclear power could even begin to contribute to reducing greenhouse emissions; and that nuclear risks are heightened in a climate-changed world (as nuclear engineer David Lochbaum puts it: "You need to solve global warming for nuclear plants to survive").

Extracts from Nick Deane's speech:

I have just come back from IPAN's fifth national conference, which was held in Darwin just one week ago. The conference was a great success. It drew contributors from every State in the nation and we had visitors from New Zealand, West Papua and Guam.....

One of the clearest manifestations of Australia's willingness to follow the USA down the path to war is the presence of a garrison of 2,500 US marines who currently reside at Robertson Barracks, a short distance outside Darwin. About 60 of us activists went from the conference to the barracks last Saturday afternoon to protest at the gates.

You can find videos of that protest and, indeed, all the proceedings of the conference on IPAN's Facebook page. I have with me a petition expressing opposition to the marine's presence and a little flyer to guide people to a similar, but separate on-line petition that we hope will spread through social media.....

Putting all this together, I guess my message is that environmental and peace issues cannot be separated and must be considered together.

This may mean that tackling militarism is as great a challenge as dealing with global warming. I really don't know which should be put first, and that really doesn't matter – but I do sense that each area of activism needs to take cognisance of the other. Us peace activists need to listen to environmental activists and environmental activists need to listen to the arguments of peace activists. Ultimately, both areas are involved in the same struggle, a struggle to change our very social system – a system that has such enormous inertia, that it will, unless we can deflect its trajectory, destroy countless lives

before it destroys itself.

There (,likewise,) remains little ambiguity with the US-led defence and security position toward Australia as a strategic hub for regional operations; a recent statement from the Lowy Institute, a non-governmental advisory body for Canberra recently issued a statement which included reference to:

“ the government will need to think more expansively about hosting US bombers and drones here, accelerating joint base developments in Papua New Guinea and deploying land-based precision-strike missiles in northern Australia”. (5)

The revelation that following the recent US-led military exercise in July a 'specialised US rocket system was to be left in the Northern Territories after exercise Talisman Sabre' has provided evidence US-led military planners regard it as their right to deploy land-based precision-missiles in Australia without seeking government approval. (6) The fact the present Morrison Coalition government in Canberra denied the existence of the specialised US rocket system and officially ruled out the siting of similar systems in northern Australia is further evidence of a prevailing attitude in such circles to a culture of denial and political expedience.


