AUKUS is an aggressive military pact led by the US for a war with China.

AUKUS is turning Australia into a major US military base and launching pad for US-led war in the region. It risks locking us into another disastrous US-led war.





Israel's decision under its fanatic ethno-nationalist government to both approve more West Bank settlements and invade Gaza City now

tragically defines the whole Zionist project: a 70-year campaign to purge Palestinians and create a greater Israel. Netanyahu's criminality now defines Israel's mission and recasts its history.

An Israel run by settlers and religious fanatics will now demolish the last houses of Palestinians in Gaza and starve them, "concentrating" them (this verb chosen with deliberation) into tents in the south and offering them evacuation to South Sudan or Libya.

Five arrested as student protest against war in Gaza causes chaos in Melbourne

Five people have been arrested after about 300 high school and university students skipped class to rally against the war in Gaza by stopping traffic in Melbourne's CBD.

A tense stand-off took place between the group and police outside Flinders Street Station after the protesters sat in the middle of the busy intersection at Flinders and Swanston streets about 3pm.....

The protesters were demanding an end to Australian military trade with Israel and for universities to end research and investments in the defence sector.

"Our politicians continue to enable Israel's crimes in Gaza," National Union of Students Education Office James McVicar said in a statement.

"They are sending critical aircraft components that allow Israel to rain terror from the sky. We are taking matters into our own hands on August 7."

The major parties have just passed legislation that will allow the Government to spend an unknown amount of public funds on building housing for US troops and foreign defence contractors in Australia as part of AUKUS.

After the Liberals and Labor teamed up during the last sitting period to deny any public inquiry into the Defence Housing Australia Amendment Bill 2025, the Bill has today been rammed through the Senate.


This Bill will allow the Defence Housing Authority to build homes for foreign military personnel in Australia. It is expected that these powers will be used to build housing for the nearly 1,000 US troops to be stationed in Western Australia as part of the AUKUS submarine base in Fremantle.

Senator David Shoebridge, Greens spokesperson for Foreign Affairs and Defence, said: “The Greens have for years been campaigning for more public housing. The Albanese Government has attacked these calls, labelling public housing as unrealistic. Turns out it wasn’t.

“Today we learned if you want to live in public housing built by Labor you'd better join the US military and get Donald Trump on your side.

“AUKUS is draining public funding into the pockets of the US military and foreign arms companies.

“This Bill will not just allow for the Albanese Government to build houses for US troops but also for foreign arms companies and contractors. That means public housing for contractors from Lockheed Martin, Boeing, Northrop Grumman, Elbit Systems, Rafael and others.

Former security leaders warn major threat going

Australia is ill-prepared for sea level rise, human displacement and other security risks posed by climate change, warns a group of former national security leaders.

The Australian Security Leaders Climate Group is urging the federal government to recognise the scale of the security risks at a time of rapid warming.

Former Defence Chief Chris Barrie said Australia needed to reorder its foreign policy priorities, with traditional geopolitical risks set to be displaced by climate change.

"Australia has put all its eggs in the AUKUS basket, risking entanglement in a war with China, while the far greater threat to Australians' security is being ignored," he said.

The British experience with nuclear-powered submarines: Lessons for Australia

My new report prepared for Friends of the Earth Australia demonstrates that the development of a nuclear-powered, conventionally-armed nuclear submarine fleet entails multiple public health risks and would inevitably suffer from delays and cost-blowouts.

The British experience with SSNs reveals a litany of problems and it can confidently be predicted that problems will beset the AUKUS submarine program – the joint development of nuclear-powered submarines by the UK, the US and Australia.

Operational risks of SSN deployment include radiological pollution of marine and coastal environments and wildlife; risks of radioactivity doses to coastal populations; and the serious risk of dangerous collisions between civilian vessels and SSNs, especially in the approaches to busy naval and civilian sea ways and fishing grounds.

This petition of concerned Australians draws to the attention of the House that:

The United States of America has control of large areas of Australia's land for its military bases. The USA is the largest foreign investor in Australia, by far, with extensive shareholdings in Australia's biggest and most profitable corporations and other investments amounting to \$1.17 *trillion*. The Australia-United States Free Trade Agreement (AUSFTA) is heavily in favour of the USA, which enjoyed a trade surplus with Australia in 2023 of \$32 billion. Australia has supported the United States in every foreign war since the beginning of the 20th century; has supported the US policy of confronting Australia's biggest trading partner China at the expense of our trade; and has committed to spending \$368 billion on the Australia-United Kingdom-United States (AUKUS) agreement to buy nuclear submarines, which has been provocative to our Asia-Pacific neighbours and which experts say are unlikely to ever be delivered. Nevertheless, the US government has imposed large tariffs on Australian aluminium and steel, demonstrating that the United States will always put its national interests first, regardless of its allies. This decision confirms that it is time for Australia to chart our own course as an independent nation.

We therefore ask the House to:

Immediately assert Australia's independent national interest and cancel the expensive, unreliable, and provocative AUKUS agreement,

and invest the money we save in infrastructure and services to benefit Australians.

What Remains: Australian Nuclear Legacies from the Montebello Islands

In the 1950s, the Montebello Islands off the Pilbara coast in Western Australia were the site of three British nuclear tests. The first, in 1952, detonated inside a warship anchored off Trimouille Island, followed in 1956 by two larger blasts as part of Operation Mosaic.

In July 2025, a group of artists, writers, researchers, and nuclear survivors travelled to the Montebello Islands to explore the lasting impacts of British nuclear testing there. Next Tuesday the 9th of September (7 - 8 pm AEST) they will come together in a conversational panel to reflect on what they witnessed and experienced, and discuss what they will carry forward from their time on the islands.

Australian support for the US alliance is progressively evaporating. The longer Trump remains in the White House the greater the separation grows.

With its orchestrated but illegal bombing of Iran as a sovereign nation, its political, economic and military support of Israel throughout the genocide in Gaza, its steady weakening and undermining of our international institutions and its cancerous military-industrial complex that has infiltrated our political and financial systems, Australian support for the US alliance is progressively evaporating. The longer Trump remains in the White House the greater the separation grows.

AUKUS is in deep trouble.

The US submarine build rate has not achieved the transformational improvement needed to provide the extra submarines promised to Australia, nor is there the slightest indication that it ever will.

The Trump administration continues to use tariffs to threaten allies, while demands for Australia to increase its defence spending and to pre-commit to a war with China are getting louder and more frequent.

As a consequence of AUKUS, Australia's security policy is overly expensive, severely flawed and is not fit for the nation's defence.

Instead of focusing on securing the country, the government aim is to create a US military Mini-Me force whose role is to serve alongside the

Government claims Attorney General can't reverse decision to extradite Dan Duggan


Former Australian attorney general Mark Dreyfus signed off on the process of Washington's attempt to extradite Australian citizen Daniel Duggan in late 2022, and he provided the final greenlight last December, following the NSW Local Court having approved extradition. Yet, since Labor's Michelle Rowland took over as the nation's chief lawmaker in May, the AG's power appears to have dissolved.

A former US marine pilot, Duggan has been held in prolonged isolation in NSW maximum-security correctional facilities since 21 October 2022, in respect of a US extradition request related to a 2017 District Court of Columbia grand jury indictment, which means that Duggan, a naturalised Australian since 2012, has been in prison for over 1,000

days without any criminal offences laid against him.



