IPAN Condemns Iran School Bombing & UK's Role in Escalating Conflict

The Independent and Peaceful Australia Network (IPAN) calls on the Australian Prime Minister to unequivocally condemn the recent bombing of a school in Iran, which has reportedly killed over 100 people, mostly children, as part of a broader bombing campaign that has killed at least 555 Iranians^[1].

'This shocking loss of innocent life is a brutal escalation of an already illegal conflict and demands immediate and forceful condemnation from the Australian government', said Ms Annette Brownlie, Chairperson of IPAN.

'Australia's complicity through the Pine Gap surveillance base, which provides intelligence gathering, targeting data for United States strikes, and missile defence, makes a clear and independent stance from our government even more urgent', said Ms Brownlie.

'We also call on the Australian Government to condemn the Israeli bombing of Beirut which reportedly killed 31 people and injured 149', said Ms Brownlie.

IPAN calls on the Australian government to:

- **Provide a transparent and unequivocal assurance that no Australian facilities or personnel were used in support of the attacks on Iran.**
- **Publicly condemn the attacks as a violation of international law and the United Nations (UN) Charter.**
- **Urge all parties to cease hostilities and return to diplomatic negotiations immediately.**
- **Reaffirm Australia's unwavering commitment to the UN and its obligations as a member state.**
- **Follow the lead of the UK, which refused the US use of its airfields, including those on Diego Garcia, in support of an attack on Iran, and adopt a similarly firm and independent position.**

- **It is time for Australia to have the courage to break free from the US alliance.**

The Independent and Peaceful Australia Network (IPAN) unequivocally condemns the recent military strikes on Iran by the United States and Israel. IPAN calls on the Australian government to commit to a path of de-escalation and diplomacy.

On 21 February, protestors from Adelaide/Kaurna Yerta converged on the Royal Australian Air Force base at Edinburgh, north of Adelaide.

Like the rest of the Australian Defence Force (ADF), this base has become interoperable and interchangeable with the U.S. military. The groups involved in this protest action were Disrupt Arms Traders and IPAN-SA.

Global arms dealers have established themselves inside this base, under the protection of the Australian Defence Force. Northrop Grumman, Lockheed Martin, BAE Systems, Raytheon, Airbus, and others operate weapons programs there.

Stop AUKUS WA and IPAN members gathered with other peace activists in Rockingham on Sunday 22nd of Feb to participate in the global day of action to Close the Bases. Close the Bases is an international campaign coordinated by World Beyond War and coincides with the date that the US military took over Guantanamo Bay in Cuba.

In WA activists gathered on the beach and listened to speeches

describing the atrocious waste of money that the AUKUS deal involves and the potentially devastating environmental consequences of nuclear submarines in Cockburn Sound. The group then marched to the gates of HMAS Stirling where they made their presence known with some more speeches and chants.

HMAS Stirling is a key location for the dangerous AUKUS submarine project and could have UK and US nuclear powered submarines rotating there by 2027. The Force Posture Agreement gives the US military access to “agreed” Australian military facilities and poses a huge threat to our sovereignty.

Stop AUKUS WA and IPAN are committed to raising awareness of this issue and call on the government to end the agreement, and instead to work towards a peaceful and sustainable future.

Australia seals UK defence deal with \$300m for AUKUS sub reactors

Australia will deepen its defence ties with Britain by spending \$310 million on a new stage of the AUKUS submarine project as well as

launching joint work on radar systems, drones and missile tests that could help Ukraine.

The agreement was sealed in London on Monday night in a meeting between Australian and UK ministers that cleared the way for closer links in the defence industry to develop defensive weapons.

Australia has previously pledged \$5 billion to help fund the development of the nuclear power systems for the AUKUS fleet, but the new spending is the first payment for equipment from Rolls-Royce to be installed in the first submarines.

The \$310 million will buy the first components for the nuclear reactors to be supplied by Rolls-Royce and transferred to South Australia for fitting to the first two AUKUS vessels to be built at the Osborne shipyard.

Extract from his podcast:

"The US objective is regime change... this has been an Israeli dream for 30 years.

Israel has used its effective ownership of Washington, which it does own for a variety of reasons to have the US prosecute wars in Libya, Iraq, Sudan, Syria, Somalia, Gaza, Lebanon, West Bank, Yemen and Iran has always been the big prize.

The aim is Israeli military hegemony in the region backed by the US, the suppression of the Arab world and effectively the expulsion of Russia and China from the region.

The US is fighting at this moment for global hegemony- this is part of a world war that the US is waging. The war came to Venezuela, and it is going to come to Cuba; it is already in Cuba as the President has said the US would make a friendly take-over of Cuba. The war is in the Middle East. Europe is already a vassal region of the United States. It is the US waging war, even in a multi-polar world, to retain its hegemony."

Campaign for International Cooperation and Disarmament : 2nd March 2026

Statement of condemnation of the new imperialist aggression of USA-Israel against Iran

The Campaign for International Cooperation and Disarmament (CICD) strongly Condemns the illegal murderous aggression of the USA and Israel, against Iran.

The USA, while undertaking negotiations in Geneva, was moving the biggest concentration of US warships and other military machinery, since 2003, into the region. This aggression was thoroughly planned for a long time. The US and Iran were in the middle of a second round of talks over Tehran's nuclear program when the attacks happened. The Omani foreign minister, who mediated between the two sides, publicly said just days ago that "peace was within reach". It was clear

that Trump and Netanyahu never intended for the negotiations to continue. They sensed now was the best time to strike the Islamic Republic to destroy not just its nuclear program but also its military capability.

The bombing campaign launched this week was described by Washington and Jerusalem as a pre-emptive operation. US President Donald Trump has said regime change is one of the goals.

Sydney Anti-AUKUS Coalition (SAAC) calls on the Australian Labor government to pull back from its support for Israel and the United States' illegal strikes on Iran and to push for the US and Iran to halt all military action.

The expansion of the war into Lebanon and the Gulf states shows how reckless disregard for international law leads to disaster. Reports of civilian casualties, including school children, are deeply concerning.

The US and Israel have justified their attacks because of the nuclear threat, but their real aim is regime change and regional domination. Neither the US or Israel support national self-determination for the Iranian or Palestinian people.....

Defending the democratic right of political speech and assembly in Australia

The current attacks on freedom of speech and assembly through the “hate laws” and anti-protest legislation call for action.

Australians’ history in defeating repressive legislation through mass non-violent civil disobedience suggests an effective practical mode of action.

We have never lived in an Australia where true freedom of speech and political action can be practised.

As former PM John Gorton allegedly said in 1968 in relation to Vietnam War protesters:

"We will tolerate dissent as long as it is ineffective."

In response to the recent [police attack](#) on a Sydney rally opposing the visit to Australia of Israeli President [Isaac Herzog](#), an attack during which some police used protesters as punching bags, Sydney criminal lawyer [Nick Hanna](#) said in a [podcast interview](#) that:

"We don't have a constitutionally enshrined right to free speech in the same way as they do in the United States. What we have here is a very limited form of freedom of speech if you can call it that; it is the implied freedom of political communication which has severe limitations."

We need a Human Rights Act in NSW.

Massive inequality in access to essentials like housing and healthcare, ever-increasing restrictions on our right to protest, and laws criminalising First Nations youth and targeting those speaking out against the genocide in Palestine defined 2025 in NSW politics – and will only continue to do so.

Late last year, as the NSW Greens spokesperson on Human Rights, I introduced a Bill to establish a NSW Human Rights Act.

The Bill was drafted in close consultation with legal and human rights experts from the Human Rights Act 4 NSW Alliance, which is made up of 110+ member organisations who support an inquiry into a human rights act.

The Bill seeks to establish a NSW equivalent of laws in the ACT, Queensland, and Victoria that protect the right to protest, the right to housing, disability rights, healthcare rights, and the right to a healthy environment.

After witnessing Parliament's shockingly authoritarian overreach in January in forcing through a law in just 24 hours that can ban groups and jail members, retrospectively and even without a crime being committed, the Citizens Party has today launched a petition to stop an equally authoritarian bill from the Albanese government that makes Australia a permanent police state.

The bill is the Australian Security Intelligence Organisation Amendment Bill (No. 2) 2025, which expands the interrogation powers that turned ASIO into Australia's secret police in 2003, and repeals the sunset clause to make those powers permanent.

These are powers that caused political consternation in 2002-03, and provoked Labor Opposition Leader Simon Crean to accuse Prime Minister John Howard of establishing a "police state".

Petition Summary

We therefore ask the House to:

- 1. Reject the Australian Security Intelligence Organisation Amendment Bill (No. 2) 2025; and**
- 2. Repeal all of ASIO's secret police powers enacted since 2003 and return to the principle of civilian policing under independent judicial oversight.**


Antidotes for pepper spray

The best antidotes for pepper spray include rinsing with water, using dairy products like milk, and applying baking soda or commercial decontamination products.

Effective Remedies for Pepper Spray Exposure

1. **Rinse with Water:** Start by flushing the affected area with cool, clean water. This helps to dilute the capsaicin, the active ingredient in pepper spray, but may not be sufficient on its own due to the oil-based nature of capsaicin.
2. **Use Dairy Products:** Dairy products, particularly whole milk or yogurt, can effectively neutralize the burning sensation. Capsaicin is oil-based, and dairy helps to break down the oils. You can apply milk directly to the skin or soak a cloth in it and place it on the affected area.
3. **Baking Soda Paste:** Mixing baking soda with water to create a paste can help neutralize the acidity caused by pepper spray. Apply the paste to the affected skin for a few minutes before rinsing it off.


