Australia is Failing its Citizens and National Interests by Giving Assange to the US

The Walkey award-winning Australian journalist, publisher and WikiLeaks founder Julian Assange will find out Jan. 4, 2021, if he will be extradited to the United States to face espionage charges, while his government remains silent.

The Independent and Peaceful Australia Network, which initiated the People's Inquiry exploring the case for an independent and peaceful Australia, is greatly disturbed by the unwillingness of the Australian government to protect their citizens as well as Canberra's subservience to its supposed ally in the US.

Despite a UN Special Rapporteur saying in 2019 that Assange showed "all the symptoms typical for prolonged exposure to psychological torture"; Assange being the first journalist to be indicted under US espionage charges; and the requirement of countries to protect their citizens abroad, successive governments have failed to assist

Assange.

How to achieve a peaceful and independent foreign policy is at the heart of the People's Inquiry - Assange's imprisonment, torture and possible extradition are reminders of the need for this change. There is a very slight chance that the UK court may refuse Assange's extradition to the US, although all indications are that they will agree to it. Regardless of the outcome, the continuing injustices faced by Assange shows that the Australian government has failed in its duty to protect its citizens and failed to assert Australian interests over those of the US.

AUSTRALIAN CULTURE AND MILITARISM

(An extract from his article: "FIXING THE SAS CULTURE IS ULTIMATELY A POLITICAL PROBLEM")

Military organsations are reflections of the societies that produce them

and so there is plenty in the Brereton Report for all of us to contemplate. Perhaps without realising it, the contemporary Australian culture has become one of veneration of the armed forces, be it the jingoism that now applies to much of Anzac Day; the \$500 million expansion of the War Memorial; the \$100 million white elephant in the form of the museum at VillersBretonneux Military Cemetery named after Sir John Monash – all the way through to the appointment of numerous retired officers as Commonwealth and State Governor-Generals. All of this – and much more – have put sections of the military on a pedestal. That being the case, it is hardly surprising that some have developed a feeling of being special and therefore above either scrutiny or reproach. Journalists working in the domain know how frustrating it can be to do their job and cover what is going on, be it mundane procurement matters or the detail of current operations. As the Brereton Report shows, if there had been more scrutiny of the SAS in Afghanistan the outcome for everyone might have been better.

WATCHING BRIEF 20-12: THE FUTURE OF PALESTINE

December, 2020

This Brief looks at the trends affecting Palestine and particularly the two-state solution that has long been advocated. Background The Trump Administration in January 2020 put forward a 'Middle East Plan'

to resolve the Israel-Palestinian conflict. This followed an earlier plan in June 2019 that concentrated on economic aspects. No Palestinians were involved in the negotiations that led to the plan, and it was widely seen as biased towards Israel. The plan rejected a Palestinian capital in East Jerusalem and required few concessions from Israel in relation to the annexation of land. The Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu made it clear that Israel would annex the Jordan Valley and West Bank's settlement while committing not to create new settlements.
