Re-structuring the ADF as a self-reliant force concentrating on territorial defence of Australia only and without foreign assistance





Discussion with Dr Albert Palazzo & Dr Mike Gilligan followed by Q & A

Current Australian defence policy is based on relying on the protection of a big power, the USA. This close relationship has drawn Australia into disastrous wars including Vietnam, Afghanistan and Iraq. IPAN holds that Australia can indeed defend itself without foreign assistance and that our ADF should be confined to this specific task and not join in expeditionary wars with the USA. This webinar discusses what adjustments need to be made to enable the ADF to do this, and what items currently on the government's multibillion dollar military spending splurge including nuclear-propelled submarines are unnecessary for this self defence orientation.

Dr Sue Wareham OAM is President of the Medical Association for Prevention of War. She is also Secretary of Australians for War Powers Reform.

Dr Albert Palazzo, Formerly the long-serving Director of War Studies for the Australian Army, Dr. Albert Palazzo is currently an Adjunct Professor at the University of New South Wales - Canberra. He completed his PhD i/n military history at The Ohio State University, his dissertation subsequently published as Seeking

Victory in The Western Front; the British Army and Chemical Warfare in World War 1. Born and raised in Brooklyn, New York, he migrated to Australia in 1996 and commenced his career in the School of History at the Australian Defence Force Academy. He has written more than twenty books and monographs on the art of war, including The Australian Army: A History of its Organisations, 1901-2001, The Australian Army and the War in Iraq, The Battle of Crete, From Moltke to Bin Laden: The Relevance of Doctrine in Contemporary Military Environment, and Planning not to lose: The Australian Army's New Philosophy of War. His next book is Climate Change and National Security: The implications for the Military which will be released in September.

Dr Mike Gilligan worked for 20 years in defence policy and evaluating military proposals for development, including time in the Pentagon on military balances in Asia. He has authored a number of articles in Pearls and Irritations including, "Our Defence Minister spurns realism, imperilling Australia", June 22, 2022, "AUKUS is not about defending Australia but a possible US attack on China", June 2, 2022 and "AUKUS and submarines — a slippery slope", April 27, 2022. He is a strong believer in our ADF's ability to defend territorial Australia without foreign assistance.



"Australia cannot hope to evade Chinese enduring enmity from such considered and direct assistance to an attempt to make China profoundly existentially vulnerable to US nuclear attack"



A position statement by Australians for War Powers Reform

1. On 15 September 2021, with no public consultation, Australia entered into a trilateral security arrangement with Britain and the United States, known as the AUKUS Partnership. The Leader of the ALP Opposition was informed one day earlier. The agreement is expected to become a Treaty in 2022.

2.

3. At short notice on 16 September, Australia cancelled its contract with France to purchase and build 12 submarines, and replaced it with an arrangement to buy eight nuclear submarines from either Britain or the United States or both. The first of these submarines is unlikely to be available until 2040 at the earliest, with major uncertainties in relation to

- cost, delivery schedule and the ability of Australia to support such a capability.
- 3. Australians for War Powers Reform sees the public announcement of AUKUS as a smokescreen for other undertakings between Australia and the United States, the details of which are vague but which have major implications for Australia's security and Independence. AUKUS itself is a precursor to war in our region.

In March this year the Federal government announced a decision to develop a nuclear submarine base on Australia's east coast with Defence identifying Brisbane, Newcastle and Port Kembla as the most suitable locations. Military chiefs to hold talks on basing UK nuclear submarines in Perth

British nuclear-powered attack submarine HMS Astute at HMAS Stirling Royal Australian Navy base in Perth, Western Australia, Australia, 29 October 2021. Britain is to send a fleet of nuclear submarines to the Pacific in a decisive move to thwart Chinese aggression in the region.

The prospect of British submarines being based out of Perth with Australian sailors on board to undergo nuclear training will be advanced, with the head of the UK military to hold top-level talks with Australian officials next week......

Admiral Radakin will meet a number of Australian officials, including recently reappointed Chief of the Defence Force Angus Campbell. In Sydney, he will attend the Indo-Pacific Chiefs of Defence conference and meet counterparts from South-East Asia and the south-west Pacific.

A key topic of talks with General Campbell and others will be how Britain can help Australia plug a potential capability gap between the retirement of the ageing Collins class submarines and arrival of the nuclear-powered boats, which Defence Minister Richard Marles says may not be delivered until the 2040s.

The Australian Financial Review understands this could involve the UK deploying its nuclear-powered submarines to Perth for operations in the region.

As part of this, Australian submariners would be incorporated in British crews to undertake training on operating nuclear-powered submarines, while infrastructure would be built up in readiness to base Australian submarines.
